Road Closure Vehicle Exemption Pass

The Boulder Backroads Marathon & Half Marathon will be held Sunday, September 28, 2003 between 6:30 am and 1:30 p.m.

The road between the West Gate of the Boulder Reservoir north to Niwot Road will be entirely closed to vehicular traffic between 6:30 am and 1:30 pm that day. This is to ensure the safety of 3,000+ runners and walkers who will be participating in this event.

Members of the Boulder Aeromodeling Society, who wish to reach the flying field during this time period, are requested to take this pass with them to obtain access to the field on that day after 10:00 a.m.

Members are also requested to please use the Monarch Road/63rd Street intersection to access the field that day, since runner traffic will not be as heavy at that intersection, particularly after the field opens at 10:00 am.
