BAS Meeting Minutes, 6/13/2018 HobbyTown Longmont

The meeting was called to order at Chandler Field by President Chester Shans at 6:30 pm.

There were 8 members present.

A motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting was made by Murray Lull. Motion passed.

There was no Treasurer or Secretary report at this meeting.

Al Coelho reported that we currently have 75 members, with 26 float fliers.

Chester reported on the following items:

The 2018 Downed Aircraft Training was conducted by Joy Masters on 6/1/2018. 12 members attended and are now authorized to retrieve aircraft in the restricted areas. A list of these authorized aircraft retrievers, sorted by distance from the field, is posted on the shelter bulletin board. There are also new signs regarding flight restrictions on the main gate, the spectator fence, the shelter bulletin board, and on the BAS website. Chester will also forward a copy to James Mack for inclusion in the next BAS newsletter.

A work party will be scheduled for Saturday, 6/23/2018 at 10:00 am. Items to be completed:

- Paint tables and flight benches (Chester will consult with a painter to determine the best way to cover the oil soaked flight benches.
- Install yellow caution tape on the step in the shelter.

- Install 1/4" hardware cloth to protect the shed from birds.
- Paint the runway "X"s and stripes.
- Install a new lexan cover over the Chandler Field sign.

Al Coelho reported that a new battery has been installed in the mower. Murray Lull will mow the approved areas.

Greg Hine made a suggestion that we should consider utilizing Dickies for food service at the BAS picnic. He felt this seemed appropriate since we utilize the owner's Hobbytown facility for winter meetings. Chester will discuss this with David Goodnow, since he is coordinating the picnic.

Al Coelho reported that he and Rich Anderson completed weed spraying on Tuesday, 6/5/2018. Al expressed thanks to Rich for providing the tractor and sprayer.

Al also discussed that a box of items was left at the field by Christopher Jung. The items are donated to the club. It was decided that the items will be brought to the field at the picnic on July 21st. Two engines new in box, a Saito 120 and an OS 61 will be offered for sale with proceeds going to BAS. All other items will be available for free.

Mike Gulizia discussed a technical concern with the BAS website and membership process. Currently site hosting is graciously provided by James Mack. Al Coelho has also been our benefactor for years, by providing the software, data storage and access for the BAS membership program. Al will no longer be maintaining his current hosting service. We are trying to determine if workarounds

Watermelon/Cantaloupe


Soft drinks, Fruit drinks and Water will be available.


Picnic fun fly events

Washer drop - The washer drop contest involves dropping a washer and streamer from your plane, aiming for a spot on the runway. Al Coelho printed up two types of boxes you can stick to your plane with blue tape or whatever you like.

One works for top mounting, the other for side mounting. See the two examples below.





Spot landing - A line will be drawn across the runway and the closest one to the line on touchdown wins. The touchdown spot is where the main gear first touches the runway.

The roller worked pretty well in my opinion."

Murray Lull reported that we have 3 students in training or scheduled for training, and one more potential student.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting at 7:23. Motion passed.
