BAS Meeting Minutes, 10/11/2017

Hobbytown USA

Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by Vice President Chester Shans.

Dean Ehn moved that the minutes of the previous meeting be approved as published. Motion approved.

Dean reviewed the Treasury report. The paving has been paid for, and it was agreed that we would retain the funds in the Training Fund for future use.

Al Coelho reported we have 90 members at this point, versus 89 last year at the same time. Several renewals have been received.

Al also noted that Nominations for Officers for 2018 are due by the November meeting, with elections to be held at the December meeting. Al stated that he would not be running for the Newsletter Editor position and was concerned that we may not get a volunteer. It was suggested that if we do not get a volunteer, that we eliminate the position of newsletter editor, and just post the minutes of each meeting on the club website. Special notices can be taken care of by broadcast emails to all members.

Chester Shans reported that the carburetor for the runway striping machine has been rebuilt by Al Coelho, and the

motor now runs. The machine may need new tires.

Chester also noted that the bird restrictions are no longer in place, and we can mow the appropriate areas. He also indicated the city has been working with us to deal with the issue of prairie dog holes in the flight station area.

Ken Jochim reported on the installation of the tongue jack on the float fly boat trailer. The cost was around \$30, versus the \$100 approved last meeting. While the jack works, the trailer tongue twists badly. Ken suggested we replace the tongue with a 2" x 2" steel tube during the winter. A motion to that effect was made and approved, for up to \$50. A short work party will need to be scheduled so several of us can slide the boat off the trailer so we can work on the tongue. Ken will follow up on this topic once the float flying season winds down.

Ken indicated there has been no interest expressed in FPV activities, per the note in last month's minutes.

Due to Daylight Donuts new owners not being open on Mondays, the new location for the Monday "donuts-in-lieu-of-float-flying" has been changed to the Dunkin Donuts at 64 Ken Pratt Avenue, just east of Main Street.

Wendell indicated that there is a group of CAP (Civil Air Patrol) Cadets at a local church that have expressed interest in some training at the field. They apparently have a Calypso glider. Chester indicated that if the group was interested, they should contact him. The topic continued with a discussion of the AMA Introductory Pilot program. Several people indicated they would be willing to sign up to be intro pilots, and Ken indicated he would look into it

There being no further business, a motion was made that the meeting be adjourned. Meeting adjourned at 7:30 pm.

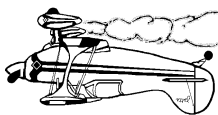

ON EACH ITEM BEING AUCTIONED, A 3 X 5 CARD MUST BE ATTACHED THAT INCLUDES YOUR BIDDER NUMBER, ITEM NUMBER, A MINIMUM BID AND A SHORT DESCRIPTION.** YOUR BIDDER NUMBER WILL BE LISTED FIRST ON 3 X 5 CARD AND YOUR ITEM NUMBER WILL BE SECOND. EXAMPLE: YOU HAVE BIDDER NUMBER 105. FIRST ITEM IS NUMBER 1 SO ON THE 3 X 5 CARD YOU WOULD LIST 105-1. SECOND ITEM 105-2 AND SO ON.
