Flying field

Last meeting at the field this year.

REMINDER

The last person to leave the flying field needs to ensure that the gate to the field is locked. The gate must be locked with the club's padlock locked through the city's lock in order to allow the city to have access to the field.

Any maintenance work at the field must be coordinated and approved by club officers and Boulder City staff. All maintenance work to be done at the field must first be coordinated with club vice president Rich Anderson (303) 652-2224. Rich will coordinate requested projects with club officers and Matt Claussen with the Boulder City Parks and Recreation Department, and if the project is approved dates will be established for the work to be done.

FIELD PARKING

There are parking spaces at the field marked and designated as handicap parking. We've been notified that if City Park Rangers see vehicles parked in those stalls without a proper handicap tag displayed they will start issuing violation tickets. **The fine for this type of ticket is \$125.00.** All members need to be aware that, if you park in a handicap stall without a tag and a ranger comes by, it could become *an expensive day of flying.*

There was a consensus that it was a good idea and should be a project for next year.

President Augie Bruno announced that the annual Club picnic will be held at noon at the field on Saturday, August 14th. Everything is in place and should be a good time.

Rudy Glick will bring a pop-up tent and a table in order to display his engines. Rudy reported that he will have a display at the Love Air fly in.

New Business

Rich Anderson reported that the flight stations needed to have a finish applied to protect the wood. Rich stated that the BEHR product that he uses takes about twelve hours to

dry. He was authorized to get the stations treated. Rich also volunteered to spray some weeds.

The idea of having bulk fuel for sale was discussed. There was a consensus of members to consider getting fuel next spring and to ask everyone to start saving jugs.

PICTURES FROM THE FIELD

11th Annual Big Bird Festival August 21 and 22, 2004

This year, Love Air R/C club from Loveland held their annual Big Bird Festival again. Just like in the previous years, the event drew crowds of spectators from the nearby areas. Even organizers mentioned 3,000 attendance on Saturday.

I attended the Festival on Sunday and took some pictures during the noon show.



This is a scratch built German trainer of WW1 era by Avro. The builder of this incredible model spent 2 years making

the plane. The plane is reported to be a very precise scale replica of the German trainer, it even has 120 structural wires with a functional turnbuckle on each! It is powered by a 4-cylinder 4-stroke Laser engine and flies incredibly realistically.



As in any R/C event involving "big birds", scale aerobatic planes were present. Several local fliers pleased the crowd performing wild 3D maneuvers accompanied by music. There was even a synchronous performance of two 40+ % planes equipped with smoke systems. The view of one plane hovering and the other circling around was quite amusing!

The key event of the show was a flight by "Mr. Aerobatics" Chip Hyde, who piloted 42% Ultimate biplane by our neighbors from Aeroworks company.
