REMINDER

The Longmont Club is to meet with the county in February to dispute claims of excessive noise. They hope to obtain approval on a temporary basis until they can find a new location.

Augie Bruno reported that it had been discussed at the officers meeting about getting the newsletter out one week after the club meeting. This would provide the members with more time to act on information and activities approved at the meeting. Russ and Boris will try to meet this schedule.

Augie Bruno reported on the club float flying activities. The members are able to handle the things required, with the exception of an inadequate electric boat motor and battery. Discussion followed, including a cost estimate of approximately \$250.00.
