Collins club on their situation. Herb W. will check with his septic hauler about servicing a unit that would be owned by the club. Anyone knowing of a Porta Potti unit for sale, please contact one of the officers.

Tony K. made a motion to lock the Porta Potti, if one is purchased. Steve Croft seconded the motion. Motion carried. Dean Chandler made a motion to proceed with the paving project. Lee Sturgeon added an amendment authorizing the officers to spend up to a maximum of \$12,500.00 and to proceed ASAP. Motion seconded by Joe Mozgai. Motion carried.

Membership:

Steve Croft agreed to send a reminder to those members who paid dues last year, but have not paid this year.

Announcements:

Tony Kilwein talked about the Longmont fly in on 6-25-2000. There is an opportunity for both flyers and static display. Between 11:00am and 2:00pm, there will be approximately 45 minutes for flying. The float fly netted \$210.00.

A demonstration of combat fliers was suggested as a program for next month weather permitting.

Other Business:

Brent Warren reported that he had received a call from Cindy & Ilene Lewis concerning the return of some memorabilia to the family. President Wickstrom said that he is aware of the requests. He indicated that some plans have been found.

Glenn Miller brought one of his planes, and Steve Croft had plans on display for a project that he is working on.
