ERIE AIRSHOW DISPLAY

On May 17, 2003, several club members represented Boulder Aeromodeling Society during Erie Day airshow at Erie Tri-County Airfield. They put up a display with a dozen of R/C planes and one C/L plane.

Rudy Glick brought his scratch-built 4-cylinder 4-stroke engine, a ¼ scale of an English motor of 1930-s. The engine is easy to start and it runs really smooth. The engine is very quiet (it doesn't need any mufflers!) and the idle is incredible slow.



Numerous spectators stopped by and asked BAS members questions about the planes and the engine.

The highlight of the show, from the point of view of R/C fans, was flying of two R/C jets, performed by Jeffco Aeromodelers flyers and commented by Don Bybee (who was giving a jet presentation at May club meeting).



The weather was perfect for flying jets: steady Southern wind was aligned with the runway, which allowed for impressive short take-offs and landings. The jet powered planes flew for about 10 minutes each, performing moderate aerobatics and showing incredible ability of vertical acceleration.

Surprisingly, the engine noise was very low—from the couple of hundred feet they sounded much quieter than our regular 2- and even 4-stroke engines.



At the end of the show, while driving his big SUV to pick up the planes, one club member almost hit a full-size Cessna plane, carelessly parked near our display. ☺
