GLOW FUEL BULK PURCHASE

BAS member Greg Hine has investigated the potential savings of making a one-time bulk purchase of glow fuel. The fuel we're considering for the bulk purchase is 15% nitro, 16% synthetic, 2% castor and would come in gallon jugs. (The 55 gallon barrel bulk purchase was considered too much of a hassle in the past.)

This fuel costs in the range of \$14.53 / gallon including tax and our BAS 10% discount at local hobby shops. We can purchase 4 - 4 gallon cases (16 gallons) for \$13.54, including tax, a \$0.99 savings per gallon.

If enough BAS members commit to a bulk purchase, the cost is: \$11.91 / gallon for an 80 gallon minimum (20 - 4 gallon cases). This is a savings of \$2.62 / gallon.

On May 7, Mile Hi RC club will host 2005 Mile Hi Madness RCAA Combat at the club field. Registration at 8:00 AM, Start Combat at 9:00 AM. 2548 Scale and Open B Combat.

Minimum 6 rounds, Open B RCAA rules. Four rounds 2548 Provisional Scale RCAA 2548 scale rules. Entry fee: \$20 first class, \$15 additional class. *All AMA Rules enforced, please bring your AMA card.* Helmets required!

The flying site is located in the City of Aurora on Quincy Avenue approximately 1.5 miles east of Aurora Reservoir Recreational Facility. From I-225 take Parker Road exit, go south to Quincy Avenue, go east for four miles. Go past the new E-470 underpass for 3.5 miles. Field is located on the left-hand side of the road. E-470 Opened for traffic on May 3, 1999 and may represent a quicker or easier route to Mile Hi RC Flying Field. Get off of E-470 at the Quincy Avenue exit and proceed approximately 3.5 miles east on Quincy Avenue.
