There were ten fliers. Dean commented that there weren't many fliers, but the guys from Loveland & Fort Collins brought some real nice airplanes. Glen mentioned that there was a very low turnout from the Arvada Club. Wendell reported that it appears that the club will be able to continue flying at the current field. The issue is not totally closed, as the city council still needs to vote. The runway project is still on hold. Wendell asked about the condition of the Porta Potti. Dean reported that he had put in a chemical pill recently. It was reported that the Longmont Club Auction will be held on October 21, 2000. The auction is held in the armory at 15th & main.
