BAS Meeting Minutes, 4/12/2019

Note: the meeting was held one day later than normal, due to weather issues.

The meeting was called to order by President Aidan Sesnic at 6:30 pm

A motion was made by David Goodnow to accept the minutes of the prior meeting. Motion Passed.

Secretary Ken Jochim reported that the club had received the 2019 Club Charter documents as well as the insurance documents from AMA.

Safety Coordinator Bill Mansfield mentioned that the FAA was issuing another rulemaking regarding UAS, and that the AMA was engaged in the process. Rule contents were not available at the meeting.

Al Coelho reported for Chester Shans on the membership. We have 73 members to date, which is 3 more than we had at the end of April last year. We have 21 Float Flier subgroup members.

Treasurer Dean Ehn reported on the state of the Treasury.

Old Business

Mike Gulizia, head of the "10 year plan committee", requested input on the strategy for the club going forward (what should we plan for). A memo will be drafted to all members requesting their input on ongoing plans.

Aidan reported that we had not gotten any feedback from the city on our draft contract terms.

New Business

David Goodnow reported that he planned to make some upgrades to the solar charging system, including a new charge controller and heavier wiring. Members should be aware that each outlet is limited to 15 amps (circuit breakers). Do not try to charge in such a way that your 12 volt input draw exceeds that value or the power will drop out.

We discussed the topic of the picnic, and it was agreed that we did not want to put the effort and expense into a picnic this year due to the continued declining attendance at the event.

It was suggested that we do a fun fly event instead, with prizes. Al Coelho agreed to chair the event, with help from Ken J and Aidan. The tentative date of 7/20/19 was proposed

The possibility of getting a AED (automatic defibrillator) for the field was discussed. Aidan will talk to the city about the topic.

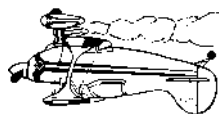
