



Mal Meador Youth Training Program

The BAS youth introductory program is intended to get young pilots (generally 12 to 18 years old) into remote controlled aircraft. The program started with a generous gift from the estate of Mal Meador, with the intent of providing young pilots with their own aircraft, free of charge, upon completion of the program. Potentially interested students need to complete the application form below.

The Mal Meador Youth Program aims to establish lifelong members of the R/C aircraft community by offering a comprehensive program and lowering the financial barriers to entry into the hobby.
Instructors

The program will be led by a training coordinator, who will choose instructors based on their availability, training experience, and willingness to train. The training coordinator will be the central point of contact for prospective students, and will assign students to instructors on their best fit.

The student will be responsible for filling out and submitting an AMA application and maintaining an active AMA membership during the training period. For students under the age of 19 there is no cost for this membership and it assures that students can fly and be covered by AMA liability.

The student shall be responsible for purchasing and assembling their own field box equipment prior to graduation. This normally will be an assortment of small hand tools and a lipo battery balancing charger.

Students will be expected to assist with any repairs and maintenance needed for their aircraft.

Students should commit the appropriate time for ground school study, which should require a few hours of time to familiarize them with the orientation packet.

Students should commit 2-4 hours at the field at least once a week with their assigned instructor. Training should be done regularly, preferably every week on the same day, or as needed to accommodate the schedules of both the instructor and student.

Student will be responsible for transportation to and from the airfield. Many students will be under driving age, and may need assistance to get to the field. If unable to coordinate with family to provide transportation, instructors may volunteer to provide transportation to and from the field for students.

The equipment will be club provided trainers with full house control (ie. elevator, aileron, rudder, and throttle). These trainers will be set up and test flown prior to any sessions with the student to get students flying quickly and eliminate the initial aircraft shakedown which can be frustrating to new pilots.

The instructor shall provide use of a field box during the training process, while the student is assembling his/her own field equipment. Field box should consist of no less than a box to contain assorted small tools and batteries.

The club shall provide each instructor with an appropriate buddy box system for training the student.

After completing all previous phases, the student will be given the aircraft free of charge, along with a one year junior membership to the BAS club. **Application on BAS web site. www.boulderaero.org**
